



# BlueAnt®

The BlueAnt Supertooth Light 'yes' Optus edition gives you the added feature of a Hotkey button that is programmed to directly call Optus 124YES.

Optus 124YES allows you to contact an operator to request a phone number or be transferred to that phone number. Simply press the 'yes' Optus Hot Key and you can then request the operator connect you to most publicly listed telephone numbers in Australia. In addition, Optus 124YES allows you to request that the name and phone number of the person whose number you have requested be sent to your mobile phone as a SMS. If the number is busy or is not answered, you can re-dial it or store it in your phone's address book\*.



There are a few changes to the operation of the Supertooth Light outlined below.

1. First time Pairing to your Bluetooth mobile phone, no change and as per page 4 of your user manual

2. New Multifunction Button (MFB) operating instructions:

Function	Time	Status
Voice dial:	Short press (MFB)	Idle / standby
Redial:	Long press (MFB)	Idle / standby
End a call:	Short press (MFB)	active call
Answer a call:	Short press (MFB)	Ringing
Reject a call:	Long press (MFB)	Ringing

3. To go to PAIRING mode

- From off, press and hold the YES Optus button
- While holding the YES Optus Button, switch the supertooth light on (press and release the microphone shaft)
- When the Bluetooth indicator turns blinking red/blue, release the YES Optus button. The supertooth light is now in pairing mode.

4. \*Pressing the 'yes' Optus button will result in connection to Optus124YES directory assistance where an operator can connect you to the telephone number you request. Use of this service is subject to the terms and conditions of your agreement with Optus Mobile Pty Ltd ('Optus') for your Optus Mobile Digital Service. Calls to Optus124YES are charged by Optus at \$1.10 (including GST) per call plus the standard call rates that apply under your agreement with Optus. The operator cannot connect your call to all numbers, such as numbers with the prefixes 19, 13, 1800, 1223, and other freecall numbers.
